## Black Breast Cancer: The Facts



Black women are <u>41% more</u> <u>likely to die</u> of breast cancer than white women.

Black women with breast cancer have a <u>71% higher relative risk</u> of death compared to white women.

Black women are diagnosed with <u>de novo</u> metastatic breast cancer at a <u>58% higher rate</u> than white women.

Black women are just as likely to have <u>hereditary breast cancer</u> <u>mutations</u> as white women, yet their participation in genetic counseling and testing is substantially lower.

Black women have <u>denser breasts</u> than white women. Having dense breasts increases your risk of developing breast cancer up to <u>six-fold</u> and regular mammograms struggle to pick up breast cancer in dense breasts.



## **Triple Negative Breast Cancer**

Triple Negative Breast Cancer is associated with worse prognosis, early relapse after standard chemotherapy, a high frequency of metastasis to lung, liver and brain and a low overall survival compared to other breast cancer subtypes.

Black women have a <u>3 times</u> higher odds of being diagnosed with triple negative breast cancer than white women.



The poorest TNBC survival was observed in Black women with only 14% five-year relative survival.

## Young Black Women



Black women under <u>35 get breast</u> cancer at two times the rate of white women and die at three times the rate.



About 30% of all newly diagnosed Black breast cancer patients are younger than 50 years old.
